

“FOUR YEAR PLAN” FOR LOS OSOS HIGH SCHOOL MUSICIANS

The following is a “four-year” plan model for students interested in participating in any of the ensembles for four-years. We would like to see our musicians continue to grow and develop but concurrently, we would like them to get an equal opportunity in receiving a great education and fulfilling their minimal high school graduation requirements. The following model fulfills the 230 credits needed to graduate high school, and it allows a period during the day, excluding zero period, for the students to play an additional hour in one of the various music ensembles. Please note that classes with an “+” are optional and flexible within the scope of four years. Summer courses may be taken on-campus or at a community college, pending availability (seats are limited).
